

William Southmayd son of William Southmayd and grandson of Sir William Southmayd, bapa Apr. 29, 1607 in Morton Hampstead, Devon Co; England. He came to America in 1640, settled 1st at Gloucester at Cape Ann, later at Salem and lastly at Boston, Mass. He was a "Mariner and Coast Trader" in command of vessels plying between Portland, Maine, Boston and Salem, Mass. and New London, Conn. He married Nov. 28, 1642 in Gloucester to Millicent Addis the eldest daughter of William Addis of Gloucester. He died in Boston, Mass. in 1646. Ch:

Millicent married William Ash in 1647 they moved to New London, Conn. in 1650 and William Ash died that same year. Millicent then married Deacon Thomas Bebee of New London, Conn. in 1651. Thomas and Millicent both died in 1699. They had four children: Thomas, Hannah, Millicent, and Rebeka.

#### 2nd Generation

William Southmayd son of William and Millicent born 1643 in Salem, Mass. He was a sea captain. He settled in Middletown, Conn. between 1655 and 1667. He married Esther daughter of Capt. Giles and Esther (Crowe) Haulin, she was born Dec. 15, 1655 in Middletown; they were married on Oct. 16, 1673. Esther died in childbed on Nov. 11, 1682. Ch:

He was invited by the town of Waterbury, Conn. to be their minister in 1699. He married in 1700 to Susannah Ward daughter of William and Susannah Phebe ward; she was born on June 16, 1674. John Southmayd was town clerk, represented the town in the General Assembly in 1740, he was returned again in his 78th year, and from 1741 he was a justice of the peace or of the peace and quorum to his death. He died Nov. 14, 1755. He held two slaves Sampson and Fillis. Susannah died on February 8, 1751. Ch:

John was elected, selectman, constable, fence viewer, collector of the country rate and member of the school committee. He died Feb. 28, 1743. Ch:

William Southmayd son of John and Millicent born 1740 in Waterbury. He graduated from Yale College in 1761; he studied for the ministry. He married Oct. 15, 1763 to Irene Todd daughter of Samuel and Mercy (Evens) Todd; she was born Oct. 25, 1744 in Waterbury. He moved to the Northbury Society (now Plymouth), Conn. before the Revolution. During the War he

was a minister in the service of the American Army. He died July 31,

1778 at Lake Champlain from small-pox. Ch:

John William Southmayd son of William and Irene born 1764 in Waterbury. After the death of his father he lived with his uncle Elias Jones in Adams, Mass. He moved to Georgia, Vt. ca. 1789 where he mar. Martha "Patty" Nichols Nov. 18, 1793 daughter of Nathan and Sarah Nichols; she was born Sept. 17, 1780 in Westminster, Vt. John William Southmayd was one of the owners of the Arnold Hill Ore Bed, at one time the largest producer of Iron ore in the world, the interest was sold at public auction on March 3, 1864. He and his sons built two large stone houses just north of Upper Jay in 1829 and 1830, by 1955 both houses were sold out of the family. Martha died June 23, 1815 and John William died July 2, His estate was still being contested in court as late as 1884. Ch:

(Martin) Bartlett, born June 8, 1843 in Jay Nathan Leroy died in a mine accident near Virginia City May 29, 1883 and Sarah E. died Dec. 29, 1917 in Detroit, Michigan. Nathan Leroy was also a Mason.
